Tri-County Beekeepers Meeting Tuesday, February 7, 2017

Officers Vern Heise, Jason Nyholm, Mitch Theis, Juliet Brambrink were present. Member attendance was approximately 100.

Vern called the meeting to order at 7:00. Seven new members were present.

Speaker Gary Reuter from the University of Minnesota Bee Lab presented to the group. Topics included honeybee research and discoveries.

 - Price is before tax.

 - The club will place one order and coordinate pick-up. If you want to order on your own through Kooiman or another vendor such as Nature's Nectar that is your responsibility.
 - Wayne and Cindy Rusch also have nucs available for order until the end of the month. Cost is \$150 for a 4-frame nuc with queen. They also have two vaporizers for sale, 1 year olf, \$100 each.
- It is time to renew membership. Dues are \$10 per year for a family.
